What to Visit in Sorrento and Surrounding Areas

Sorrento and its surroundings offer a variety of attractions ranging from natural beauty to history and culture. Here are some must-see places to visit:



Sorrento Historic Center

Piazza Tasso: The beating heart of Sorrento, with many cafes and shops. It is perfect for taking a stroll and soaking up the local atmosphere.

Sorrento Surroundings

There are many charming towns around Sorrento that are worth a visit. Here are some of the most beautiful and interesting ones that are nearby:

Sant'Agnello (3 km from Sorrento)



A quiet town that is right next to Sorrento. It is a great base for exploring the area, with quieter beaches than Sorrento and a panoramic view of the Gulf of Naples. Sant'Agnello is also known for its gardens and historic villas.

Villa Fondi

The best way to get from Sorrento to Sant'Agnello is by line 1 train which takes 2 min and costs €1. Alternatively, you can line 008 bus, which costs €2 - €3 and takes 5 min.

Massa Lubrense (8 km from Sorrento)

Massa Lubrense is a charming village that stretches out on the tip of the Sorrento Peninsula. It is known for its wild nature and beautiful bays.

Marina del Cantone

One of the most beautiful locations in Massa Lubrense, this bay is famous for its crystal clear water and golden sand. It is a great place to swim, snorkel or simply relax on the beach. It is also a good starting point for boat trips, especially to visit the famous Baia di Ieranto.

Sentiero degli Dei

Although the Sentiero degli Dei is more well-known in the Agerola area, it is still easily accessible from Massa Lubrense. It is a hiking trail that offers incredible views of the Amalfi Coast and the Sorrento Peninsula. A perfect walk for trekking and nature lovers.



Punta Campanella

This promontory is the southernmost point of the Sorrento Peninsula and offers spectacular views of Capri, Ischia and the Gulf of Naples. The Punta Campanella lighthouse is a popular attraction, and the surrounding area is perfect for nature walks.

Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie

Located in the historic center of Massa Lubrense, this church is an interesting example of religious architecture. Its location offers panoramic views of the surrounding countryside.

Marina di Puolo

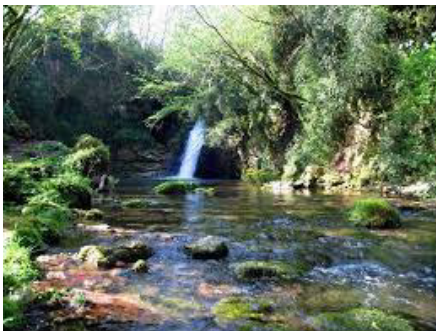

Faito Waterfall



If you are a nature lover, you could take a trip to Faito, a mountain that is located not far from Massa Lubrense. The Faito waterfall is a small but fascinating natural wonder that is worth a visit, and the surrounding area is ideal for hiking.

Boat excursions

Boat excursions also depart from Massa Lubrense that will allow you to explore the coast of the Sorrento Peninsula, nearby Capri and other coastal points of interest. You can take a private boat tour or a group excursion to admire the wonders of the sea.

***The best way to get from Sorrento to Massa Lubrense is the 5070 line or the 5071 bus which leaves from Via degli Aranci, 41 towards Sorrento-Massa-S.Agata. There are 17 bus stops. the cost of the ticket is approximately € 2,00.
The travel time by bus from Sorrento to Massa Lubrense is generally about 20-30 minutes,***

Vico Equense (15 km from Sorrento)



Located on the coast, Vico Equense is another charming town with spectacular views of the sea and Mount Vesuvius. It is famous for its gastronomic traditions, especially pizza and fresh fish. The town also offers a beautiful beach and panoramic views.

Monte Faito

Monte Faito is a perfect destination for hiking and trekking. You can reach the top of the mountain by cable car. Ancient Baths of Vico Equense

Local gastronomy

Vico Equense is also famous for its cuisine, especially pizza and seafood. The area boasts some historic pizzerias and restaurants serving local specialties, such as pizza a metro. Don't forget to try the typical desserts, such as delizia al limone, a very popular dessert in the region.

To reach Vico Equense from Sorrento by public transport, you can choose between two main options: Take the train towards Naples and get off at the Vico Equense stop. The journey takes about 10-15 minutes and costs €2.40

Bus (Sita Line) You can take a bus from the Sorrento bus station towards Naples and get off at Vico Equense, ticket price €2.00

Positano (16 km from Sorrento)

Arguably one of the most iconic towns on the Amalfi Coast, Positano is famous for its colorful houses that climb the mountain. The narrow streets, beaches and breathtaking views make it a must-see destination.

The easiest and most direct solution is to take a Sita bus from the Sorrento bus station (near the train station) towards Amalfi, which stops in Positano. Travel time: About 40-50 minutes, the ticket costs about 3.00



Agerola (23 km from Sorrento)

Located in the hinterland of the Amalfi Coast, Agerola is known for its natural beauty and for being the entrance to the famous Path of the Gods, a scenic trekking route that offers breathtaking views of the coast

Amalfi (30 km from Sorrento)

The town of Amalfi is the heart of the Amalfi Coast and is famous for its cathedral, the Duomo di Sant'Andrea, and the picturesque streets that wind between the white houses. It is also a great starting point for exploring the surrounding area.

Cattedrale di Sant'Andrea (Amalfi Cathedral)



The Cattedrale di Sant'Andrea is one of the iconic places in Amalfi. Its Moorish façade and grand staircase leading to the entrance are spectacular. Inside, you can admire a combination of architectural styles, with mosaics, frescoes and works of art that tell the story of the city. The crypt houses the relics of St. Andrew, the patron saint of Amalfi.

Cloister of Paradise

Adjacent to the Cathedral, the Cloister of Paradise is a charming medieval cloister with elegant columns, arches and gardens. It is a quiet and relaxing place where you can take a walk immersed in the history of Amalfi.

To get to Amalfi from Sorrento by public transport, you have two main options:

Bus (SITA) The Sita line connects Sorrento to Amalfi directly. Starting from the Sorrento bus station (near the train station) you will arrive directly to Amalfi. Duration: The journey takes about 1 hour and 15 minutes

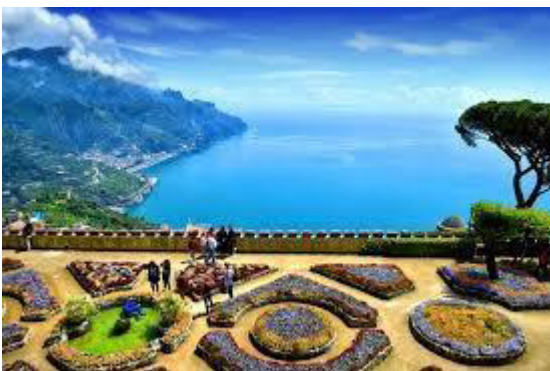
Train and bus (via Salerno) Another option, a little longer, involves the use of the train:

Train: Take a train from Sorrento Circumvesuviana station towards Naples and get off at Salerno station.

Bus: From Salerno, take a Sita bus or another bus service that takes you directly to Amalfi. This route could take about 1 hour.

This option is more complex and requires at least one change, so the direct bus from Sorrento to Amalfi is usually the best choice.

Ravello (40 km from Sorrento)



Ravello is famous for its historic villas and panoramic gardens, such as Villa Rufolo and Villa Cimbrone, which offer spectacular views of the Amalfi Coast. Ravello is also an important cultural center, known for its music festival.

Villa Rufolo This historic villa, dating back to the 13th century, is famous for its terraced gardens and for hosting the Ravello Festival, a renowned summer music event. Strolling through its gardens, you can enjoy spectacular views of the coast.

Villa Cimbrone and the Terrace of Infinity Villa Cimbrone is another historic residence that offers enchanting gardens and the famous Terrace of Infinity, a natural balcony that offers

panoramic views of the Gulf of Salerno. It is the ideal place for a romantic walk immersed in nature.

Duomo di Ravello (Cathedral of San Pantaleone) Located in the heart of the village, the cathedral is an extraordinary example of medieval architecture. Inside, you can admire mosaics and frescoes that tell the religious history of Ravello.

Piazza Vescovado This square is the beating heart of Ravello, surrounded by historic buildings and outdoor cafes. It is the perfect place to stop for a relaxing coffee and watch the daily life of the village.

To get from Sorrento to Ravello by public transport, there are several options, but they all require at least one change:

Bus (via Amalfi) The most common option is to take a SITA bus from Sorrento to Amalfi, and then take another bus from Amalfi to Ravello.

Steps: Sorrento to Amalfi: Take a Sita bus from Sorrento bus station (near the train station) to Amalfi. This journey takes about 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Amalfi to Ravello: Once in Amalfi, take a Sita bus or other public transport up the hill to Ravello. This journey takes about 30-40 minutes.

Train and Bus (via Salerno) Another option, longer and more complex, involves taking the train.

Steps: Sorrento to Salerno: Take the train from Sorrento Circumvesuviana station towards Naples, then change in Naples and take a train to Salerno. This journey takes approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes.

Salerno to Ravello: Once you arrive in Salerno, take a Sita bus to Amalfi and get off at Castiglione. From there, take another bus to Ravello. This journey can take approximately 1 hour.

The quickest option via Amalfi takes approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes, but depends on connections.

If you choose via Salerno, the journey could take approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes or more.

The cost of a Sita bus ticket for the Sorrento-Amalfi section is approximately €2.80-3.00, while the Amalfi-Ravello section could cost around €2.00-2.50.

Praiano (18 km from Sorrento)

A small and quiet village between Positano and Amalfi, Praiano is famous for its relaxed atmosphere, crystal clear waters and spectacular sea views. It is a great choice for those looking for a quieter escape away from the crowds.

Furore (25 km from Sorrento)

Furore is a picturesque village perched on the cliffs of the Amalfi Coast. It is famous for its fjord and its colorful houses overlooking the sea. The Furore fjord is an enchanting place, ideal for those who love nature and tranquility.



The most common solution is to take a SITA bus from Sorrento to Amalfi, and then change to another bus that will take you to Furore.

Sorrento to Amalfi: Take a Sita bus from Sorrento to Amalfi. This journey takes about 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Amalfi to Furore: From Amalfi, take another Sita bus that will take you to Furore. This journey takes about 20-30 minutes.

The Sita bus ticket for the Sorrento-Amalfi route costs about €2.80-3.00.

The Amalfi-Furore route costs about €2.00-2.50.

Capri (a short ferry ride away)



Although it is an island, Capri is very close to Sorrento and can be easily reached by ferry. Famous for its natural beauties, such as the Blue Grotto and the Faraglioni, Capri is an exclusive and fascinating destination. Capri is a destination that combines history, culture and natural beauty, offering unforgettable experiences to every visitor.

The Faraglioni of Capri These three rocky masses emerge from the sea and are one of the most recognizable symbols of the island. You can admire them from various panoramic points, such as the Piazzetta di Punta Tragara, or approach by boat for a closer experience.

The Blue Grotto One of the most famous natural wonders of Capri, the Blue Grotto is a marine cavity where the water takes on a deep blue color thanks to the light that filters through an underwater opening. Visits are only possible in calm sea conditions.

Monte Solaro The highest point on the island, at 589 meters above sea level, offers a spectacular panoramic view of Capri, the Amalfi Coast and the Gulf of Naples. It can be reached by a chairlift from Anacapri.

Gardens of Augustus These botanical gardens offer breathtaking views of the bay of Marina Piccola, the Faraglioni and the famous Via Krupp. They are the ideal place for a relaxing stroll immersed in the

La Piazzetta of Capri The beating heart of the island, the Piazzetta is a lively meeting point with outdoor cafes, boutiques and a panoramic view of the sea. It is the perfect place to observe daily life on Capri.

Villa San Michele Located in Anacapri, this historic villa was the residence of the Swedish writer Axel Munthe. Today it is a museum housing a collection of art and historical artifacts, surrounded by a garden with panoramic views.



Via Krupp A historic panoramic road that connects the Gardens of Augustus to Marina Piccola. Characterized by tight hairpin bends and a spectacular view, it is one of the most photographed attractions on the island.

Marina Piccola One of Capri's main beach resorts, Marina Piccola offers crystal-clear waters and a close-up view of the Faraglioni. It's the perfect place to relax in the sun or take a refreshing dip.

Villa Jovis The ruins of this Roman villa, built by Emperor Tiberius, offer an interesting insight into the island's history. The panoramic view from the villa is spectacular.

To reach Capri from Sorrento, the easiest and fastest option is to take a ferry or hydrofoil, as there are no direct connections by land.

Ferries and hydrofoils leave regularly from the port of Sorrento (Marina Piccola) to Capri.

The journey takes about 20-30 minutes depending on the means of transport (slower ferry, faster hydrofoil).

The cost of the hydrofoil ticket is generally between €15 and €20 per journey.
